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2. Course description

This course covers a range of topics, including the NZICA Code of Ethics, accounting tools and techniques, digital acumen and data analysis. The activities and assessments in this course are designed to support candidates' success in their studies and career.

3. Course learning outcomes

At the completion of this course, candidates should be able to do the following:

1. Explain and apply the NZICA Code of Ethics.
2. Explain the role and responsibilities of the accounting function, including the importance of internal controls and effective accounting systems and procedures.
3. Use appropriate tools and techniques to organise and analyse accounting information and data to meet organisational needs.
4. Explain and comply with information and cyber security requirements when handling organisational information and data.
5. Use relevant tools and techniques to analyse data quality and to efficiently and effectively monitor and communicate accounting and financial performance data.

4. Teaching and learning strategies

This subject has the following key learning components:

- Interactive topics that provide key information to support the central concepts of each topic area.
- Interactive activities that supplement the topics and demonstrate how concepts can be applied in a range of contexts. These may include videos, practice questions, articles, case studies, worked examples and other types of activities.
