CA ANZ is the only professional accounting body approved as a Higher Education Provider by the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA), Australia's independent national regulator of the higher education sector.

CA ANZ is accredited by TEQSA to deliver and award the following postgraduate qualifications Level 8 under the Australian Qualification Framework (AQF)

- Graduate Diploma of Chartered Accounting (GradDipCA)
- Graduate Certificate in Accounting (GradCertAcc) (nested 'opt-out' early exit option depending on studies completed)

AQF qualifications are recognised as comparable under the New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) and across the qualification frameworks of many other countries. Further information about AQF qualifications is available at <u>www.aqf.edu.au</u>.

Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CA ANZ) is a registered Australian higher education provider in the category of 'Institute of Higher Education' (TEQSA Provider ID: PRV12024). Further details about CA ANZ's registration as a higher education provider and the accreditation of this course can be viewed on TEQSA's National Register.

Chartered Accountants ANZ (CA ANZ) is also an Australian Government approved provider of FEE-HELP provider under Australia's Higher Education Support Act 2003 (the HESA Act 2003). FEE-HELP is an Australian Government study assistance loan scheme that helps eligible full fee-paying students pay all or part of their course tuition fees at Australian universities and other higher education providers. CA ANZ is the only professional accounting body in Australia approved by the Australian Government to offer FEE-HELP loans.

Eligible CA Program candidates will be able to access a FEE-HELP loan to pay all or part of their Graduate Diploma of Chartered Accounting (GradDipCA) subject tuition fees from Term 2 2023.

Before applying for CA ANZ'S CA Program and enrolling into the program's Graduate Diploma of Chartered Accounting (GradDipCA), intending applicants must ensure they are aware of and understand the information listed below.

 - Candidate Course Fees Refund Appeals and Review Policy and Procedure, which outlines CA ANZ's principles and procedures for setting, communicating, charging, refunding, re-crediting, and remitting CA Program course fees.
