



# Trans-Tasman Audit Advisory Committee

## Request for membership expressions of interest

We are currently seeking expressions of interests from members to join the Trans-Tasman Audit Advisory Committee (the committee). The committee brings together CA ANZ members from practice, public sector, academic and business backgrounds from both Australia and New Zealand. It's a key forum for CA ANZ to hear from audit practitioners from a range of backgrounds and interests on the current issues and emerging issues that we are advocating on and informing members about. Joining the Committee is a great opportunity to deepen your networks with other assurance practitioners, learn from their experiences, and have your voice heard on the issues that will shape the evolution of the audit profession.

## Skills and experience

We are particularly interested in hearing from audit practitioners from Australia and New Zealand from mid-tier and smaller firms who have experience auditing SMEs across a variety of industries and sectors.

Additionally, knowledge or experience in the following would be useful:

- sustainability assurance,
- using technology to innovate and drive audit efficiency, or
- assurance over emerging areas of reporting.

If you have a passion for any of these areas, are engaged with your professional community and would like to share your expertise and the wider views of those in your networks, with others in the profession, then we would be delighted to hear from you.

## Committee operation and membership commitment

The committee meets three times a year (March, June, November) with two virtual meetings and one face-to-face meeting (generally in November in Sydney). Virtual meetings are held via Teams and are generally two and a half hours long. The face-to-face meeting is held on a Monday to allow members to travel to Sydney on Sunday if necessary, and are generally six hours. Travel and accommodation is arranged and paid for by CA ANZ. Other ad hoc virtual meetings may be held during the year to discuss particular time sensitive issues, such as submissions.

A meeting pack and agenda are provided 1-2 weeks prior to the meeting to provide background on the items being discussed. There may be guests at the meetings to update the committee on current issues and provide an opportunity for discussion and feedback. Guests may be from external bodies (regulators, standard setters etc.) or CA ANZ staff whose roles are relevant to the committee's discussions.

Members are appointed for an initial term of three years. This may be extended to a second term of three years by mutual agreement. Membership is limited to a maximum of two terms. The committee appoints a chair who generally serves in that role for several years.
