Fee schedule notes

- All CA Program tuition and other (non-tuition) fees are listed in the fee schedule above.
 The applicable fee is determined by the subject's census date. All fees include GST where applicable.
- 2. CA Program candidates are not required to pay fees for enrolment in the Mentored Practical Experience component of the CA Program. CA Program candidates are required to pay Provisional Membership fees as these are additional annual (FY) subscription fees which must be paid in full in undertaking the CA Program and are available here.
- 3. Payment is in local currency for those living in Australia and New Zealand. For all other locations, payment is required in Australian dollars. Candidates with a current residential address in MyCA in NZ at time of subject enrolment must pay the applicable NZ fee listed in the schedule which is shown NZD and includes the 15% NZ GST.
- 4. **Domestic fees** are paid by any person studying a CA Program course subject who is an Australian (AU) or New Zealand (NZ) citizen, including AU or NZ citizens with dual citizenship, or any person who holds Permanent AU or NZ resident status or a Permanent humanitarian visa, or any person who is a diplomatic or consular representative of New Zealand, a member of the staff of such a representative or the spouse or dependent relative of such a representative.

These fees are applicable to Terms 1 and 2 2024 and are subject to an annual review and associated incremental increases.



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- 5. Overseas fees for candidates studying in AU are those paid by any person studying a CA Program course subject from within Australia (AU) on an AU temporary entry permit (e.g., graduate visa) or who is a diplomat or a dependent of a diplomat (except New Zealand) and resides in Australia during or at the time of enrolment in the subject. CA ANZ, as an approved provider under the Higher Education Support Act 2003 (HESA) is required to change overseas students studying it higher education courses while residing in Australia a course tuition fee that is no less than the relevant minimum indicative course fee specified in the Higher Education Provider Guidelines 2012 (HEP Guidelines) which are empowered under the HESA Act 2003.²
- 6. Overseas fees for candidates studying outside AU are paid by any person studying a CA Program course subject who is residing outside of Australia during/on enrolment in the subject who is not in a category outlined at note 4 or 5 above.
- 7. Payment options: Payment method must be selected at time of enrolment in the subject. Subjects may be paid by Credit Card (Visa, Mastercard, and American Express), Employer Token (if eligible), or FEE-HELP loan (if eligible). Subjects being paid by credit card must be paid in full at the time of subject enrolment or the subject enrolment will be automatically cancelled.

All subjects listed in the schedule are FEE-HELP eligible subject to the candidate being eligible for FEE-HELP.

For details on eligibility requirements for FEE-HELP and payment by Employer Token refer to the CA Program Candidate Course Fees, Refund, Appeals and Review Policy and Procedure.

To change payment method a candidate must withdraw from the subject and then re-enrol in the subject on or before the subject census date. After the census date the payment method cannot be changed.

Other fees are required to be paid by Credit Card (Visa, Mastercard, and American Express).

CA ANZ does not charge a Credit Card Surcharge for payments Visa/MasterCard/American Express payments.

8. Refunds:

A candidate who notifies CA ANZ of a subject withdrawal on or before the subject's census date published in the course timetable will no longer be liable for the subject's tuition fee and, if accessing FEE-HELP, no FEE-HELP debt will be incurred for the withdrawn subject. A candidate who withdraws from a subject after the subject's census date remains liable for the tuition fee for the subject, and if accessing FEE-HELP for the subject will incur a FEE-HELP debt, except where CA ANZ has approved the candidate's post-census date withdrawal due to Special Circumstances³. All other fees are non-refundable. For further information refer to the CA Program Candidate Course Fees, Refund, Appeals and Review Policy and Procedure.

9. Subject census dates⁴ are published in the CA Program course timetable available on the CA Program Timetable, Fees and Enrolment website. This timetable that lists the subjects on offer in any term, their enrolment and study and assessment periods, census date, mode of delivery and also makes clear also whether FEE-HELP assistance is available for the subject and whether there are any limits or condition of the FEE-HELP assistant available in relation to the subject.

The term 'census date' refers to the date (to 11:59pm AEST/AEDT as applicable on that date) as the deadline date for various requirements, like finalising payment for your tuition fees or formally withdrawing your enrolment so you do not incur an academic penalty for the subject tuition fee. Candidates who withdraw from their enrolled subject on or before the census date will receive a full refund of tuition fees paid upfront for the subject and will not incur a FEE-HELP debt for the subject. CA ANZ does not charge any administrative fees (i.e. late withdrawal fee). The census date for each subject is set out in the CA Program course timetable available at: www.charteredaccountantsanz.com/become-a-member/timetables-fees-and-enrolment.



These minimum fees are indexed annually for effect from 1 January in the following calendar year. If you are required to pay this fee please ensure you refer to this schedule in November each year for the updated fee that is applicable from 1 January in the following year. Overseas candidates studying in Australia on an Australian temporary entry permit may be eligible for 'CA ANZ AU Visa Candidate Scholarship'. For details please include information on your Australian visa type when applying for admission to the CA Program. Please note: Candidates studying in Australia on a student visa are not permitted to enrol in the CA Program GradDipCA course. Further details are available at CA Program Citizenship, residency, and visa requirements.

Any tuition fee amount paid upfront to CA ANZ for the withdrawn subject will be automatically refunded to the payee (including any NZ GST paid if applicable). Please also note, a candidate who withdraws from a subject after the subject census date and has not attempted any assessment, you will receive a Withdrawn Fail (WF) grade for the subject on their academic transcript and if one or more assessments have been attempted will receive a Fail Incomplete (FI) grade for the subject on their academic transcript.

10. Subject tuition fees inclusions

- Subject tuition fees include all teaching delivery, workshops, online learning resources and support materials (including but not limited to the digital study guide and all required readings for the program and access to CA ANZ's library service, orientation program and candidate support services (see CA Program Candidate Support, Health, Wellbeing, Safety & Advocacy Information).
- An online study guide (SG). If candidates wish to purchase a printed copy details will be available on the Learning Management System after subject enrolment.
- Subject tuition fees do not include the fees for services lists under 'Other Fees' or fees for any accommodation, travel or
 other expenses for attendance at workshops and exams, or costs of textbooks, study aids and equipment.
- The overseas onsite examination fee, (listed under other fees) is payable if an overseas on-site examination is requested in place of the scheduled online examination (excluding on-site examinations conducted in Malaysia by The Malaysian Institute of Certified Public Accountants (MICPA).
- 11. For details about varying or withdrawing from a subject enrolment refer to the CA Program Candidate Enrolment Terms and Conditions.
- 12. Course tuition fees are reviewed annually. For details on CA ANZ's principles and procedures for setting, communicating, charging, refunding, re-crediting and remitting CA Program candidate course fees paid to CA ANZ refer to the CA Program <u>Candidate Course Fees</u>, <u>Refund</u>, <u>Appeals and Review Policy and Procedure</u>.
- 13. Other fees may be reviewed and varied by CA ANZ at any time as required. They include (but are not limited to) charges for incidental other goods or services that are not essential to the course; alternative forms of access to goods or services essential to the course, but are otherwise readily available at no additional cost by the provider; essential goods or services where candidates have the choice of acquiring from a supplier other than the provider which then become the candidate's physical property and not consumed by the course; and fines or penalties imposed principally as a disincentive. CA ANZ will not charge fines or penalties to raise revenue or cover administrative costs.

An annual EFTSL load < 0.750 is considered a part-time study load.
