

# Notification of Appeal

from Australian Disciplinary Tribunal decision

(By-Laws 40(11.1) and 40(11.2))



Subject to [By-Law 40\(9.4\)](#), an appeal must be lodged **within 21 days** of receipt of the written decision with reasons.

Only the Member or the Professional Conduct Committee may appeal a decision of the Disciplinary Tribunal.

A notice of appeal must be submitted on this prescribed form and state the grounds of appeal in full. The grounds so stated shall not thereafter be amended except with the approval of the Appeals Tribunal.

The Appeals Tribunal may, at its discretion:

- require the Member to pay such amount as it determines as security against the anticipated *Costs* which Chartered Accountants ANZ may incur in the conduct and hearing of the appeal
- stipulate a time period of not less than 28 days within which the Member must pay such amount and, if it does so and the Member has not paid that amount at the expiry of that period, the appeal will automatically lapse.
